The garden has been worked using organic methods and includes a variety of established native plants and trees. Raised beds in the sun are ideal for annual food crops and raspberries are well established with a structure for them to grow against.

A combination of trees, shrubs, bamboo and perennials have been thoughtfully chosen and placed for their ease of care, drought tolerance, year round interest and bird habitat. A wonderful green screen lines the long drive and the mature plantings around the house provide lovely outlooks and privacy, not to mention great bird-watching!
